Agency rulemaking is not advisable given the historial trend implementing the annual appropriation.

393.066	Community Services and Treatment	No	N/A	New language requries contracted persons or entities to meet requirements established by the agency for training and professional development of staff providing direct services to agency clients. Rulemaking is not necessary since these requirements can be enforced through contract.
393.0662	Individual budgets for delivery of home and community-based services	No	N/A	New language added specific authority for the agency to approve additional funding for transportation services for agency clients under certain circumstances. Rule amendments for this provision were included in rules proceeding through the rulemaking process during the legislative session and recently adopted by the agency on June 17, 2016.
393.0679	Utilization Reviews	No	N/A	New language added specific authority for the agency to conduct utilization reviews of intermediate care facilities for individuals with developmental disabilities as necessary to meet the requirements of the State Medicaid Plan and federal law. No rulemaking authority was provided in the statute nor was it necessary for implementation.
393.11	Involuntary Admission to residential services	No	N/A	Amendments to this section removed Agency rulemaking authority to adopt a form for members of the examining committee. A standard agency form was not necessary due to the specificity of the statutory requriements provided in the section, and the fact-specific nature of each committee report. Also, the section requires the Agency to conduct annual reviews of persons involuntarily committed to the Agency for residential services, and for court review of the Agency's report of the appropriateness of a continued committment. No rulemaking authority was provided for this purpose, nor was it necessary.
