LBRS & COMMITTEE WEEKS UNDERWAY

It's currently committee week season at the Florida Legislature - the time when lawmakers meet in Tallahassee to discuss priorities and review agencies' Legislative Budget Requests (LBRs) for the upcoming fiscal year. Each fall, state agencies submit LBRs outlining their funding needs and initiatives for the year ahead. These committee meetings set the stage for the 2026 Legislative Session, which begins early next year on Tuesday, January 13, 2026. Lawmakers will consider agency budget requests, review proposed legislation, and finalize the state's spending plan for the next fiscal year. Stay tuned for updates as APD's budget priorities move through the legislative process in the weeks ahead.

IBUDGET WAIVER ENROLLMENT OFFERS

APD recently mailed more than 5,600 letters to individuals eligible to enroll on the iBudget Waiver in pre-enrollment categories 3, 4, 5, and 6. The agency has already begun receiving responses, and regional teams are starting the enrollment process. In the coming weeks, APD regional offices will host in-person forums for those who received letters to submit their enrollment forms or receive help completing waiver requirements. Staff will be available to answer questions about Medicaid eligibility, services, and benefits.
